100 years of the Liechtenstein Persons and Companies Act

With the “100 years of the Liechtenstein Persons and Companies Act” issue, Philately Liechtenstein honors the Persons and Companies Act, which came into effect on February 19, 1926, and had a significant impact on the country’s economic development. The designs “Code of Laws” (CHF 1.20), “Emil Beck” (CHF 1.90), and “Wilhelm Beck” (CHF 2.50) commemorate this historic body of law and its authors. The Persons and Companies Act laid the foundation for modern corporate structures and, together with a liberal tax law, contributed to Liechtenstein’s development as a business and financial center. In practice, public limited companies, institutions, foundations, trusts, and trust companies became particularly well established.

Photographs – Old Portraits of Personalities

With the issue “Photographs – Old Portraits of Personalities” Philately Liechtenstein commemorates notable figures and historical ways of life. “Fridolin Tschugmell” (CHF 1.90) depicts the pastor, historian, teacher, and cultural educator in 1936 with workers during the construction of the bell tower at St. Theresa’s Church in Schaanwald. The “Anton Frommelt” stamp (CHF 2.50) is based on a photograph from the 1920s and depicts a mountain haymaker on Tuass. Through his photographs, the priest, politician, artist, and photographer impressively documented rural life and the working world of his time.

Dance theater

The “Dance theater” permanent stamp series is dedicated to dance as a fusion of movement, art, and emotion. “Rock murmurs” (CHF 1.20) combines movement and nature and evokes the dynamism of Alpine landscapes. “La Principessa” (CHF 1.90) embodies expression, elegance, and vulnerability, while “Barefoot & Brocade” (CHF 2.50) plays with contrasts such as freedom and discipline. “In Green” (CHF 3.10) explores energy, community, and creative transformation. The four designs depict dance as an expression of passion, creativity, and personal emotions.

Christmas

The 2026 Christmas issue combines wintry nature, contemplation, and shared experiences. The “Christmas wreath” (CHF 1.00) symbolizes hope, steadfastness, and festive anticipation. The “Ice rink” (CHF 1.20) evokes shared winter experiences, togetherness and joy, while the “Forest Christmas” (CHF 1.90) captures the special atmosphere of light, snow, and the winter forest. The “Forest cabin” (CHF 2.50) conveys warmth and a sense of security in a snow-covered landscape. In this way, the series combines traditional Christmas motifs with warm and evocative imagery.



Chinese Signs of the Zodiac – Year of the Goat

With the “Year of the Goat” (CHF 2.50), Philately Liechtenstein continues its “Chinese Signs of the Zodiac” series. The commemorative stamp was designed by the renowned Chinese artist Han Meilin. In the Chinese zodiac, the Goat symbolizes harmony, creativity, compassion, and tranquility. People born under this sign are also said to possess an appreciation for art, a sense of community, and inner balance. This issue combines traditional Chinese symbolism with contemporary artistic design and underscores the international character of Liechtenstein’s philately.
